This program is designed to offer a broad-based update on traditional techniques as well as new ideas in the field of orthopedic surgery.

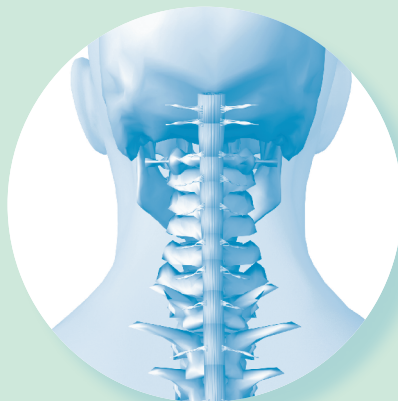
Target Audience

Program Objectives

- Assess the various surgical options used to treat rotator cuff tears in young patients, and describe which techniques are most efficacious in various scenarios.
- Discuss the options for treatment of hip fractures including open reduction and internal fixation, hemiarthroplasty, and total joint arthroplasty, and identify the optimal and most cost-effective treatments.
- Compare non-operative treatment and surgical management options for distal radius fractures in older patients.
- Analyze contemporary literature to determine which surgical or non-operative treatment is most appropriate for a given physiological age and activity level of individual patients.
